

Semester in Scotland

Scottish Christian History: 1st and 2nd Scottish Reformations (3 credits) BIB 353 or Social Science XXX

This course explores the 1st and 2nd Reformation of Scotland, investigating the differing views on faith, culture, and identity that permeated the internal struggles of the country within Church and State during this time period.

Through reading and consideration, the expectation is that the student will come to a better understand how Christianity should be manifested in the daily life of the believer, including times of religious persecution.

This class culminates in a week long Reformation Tour, visiting various sites discussed in the course, including: St. Andrews, Edinburgh, and rural sites in East Ayrshire, Dumfries, and Galloway.
